## GOOD FAITH ESTIMATES FOR NON-EMERGENCY DENTAL CARE

You have the right to receive a "Good Faith Estimate" explaining how much your dental care will cost.

Under the law, health care providers must give patients who don't have insurance or who are not using insurance an estimate of the bill for dental services.

- You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any non-emergency services.
- Make sure your health care provider gives you a Good Faith Estimate in writing at least 1 business day before your dental service. You can also ask your health care provider, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule your dental treatment.
- If you receive a bill that is at least \$400.00 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.
